Introduction

The Burnsville Parks Visioning Plan was completed at the request of the Burnsville City Council as an extension of the Burnsville Parks Plan to further assess and define needs for specific parks within the Burnsville Park System. These plans create individual master plans for each park to guide park maintenance, short-term development and long-term visioning for each park providing a comprehensive and directed management for each park. These vision plans are intended to work in partnership with the current Burnsville Parks Plan, the City CIP (capital improvement plan) and community needs as identified in the community engagement process.

The Visioning Plan included the planning of 26 parks within the park system consisting of some community parks and some neighborhood parks as identified by city staff. These 26 parks had some of the highest number of condition 1 and 2 amenities needing to be addressed in the next 1 to 5 years as identified by the Parks Plan update. As part of this process, an intercept-style engagement plan with the community took place within these parks to gather information from residents and visitors on how they use the parks and any ideas for improvement. In addition to the intercepts, online engagement gave the public the opportunity to provide further feedback throughout the process.

This engagement was used in

combination with the community input provided during the Park Plan development process. Utilizing this feedback the design consultant conducted an internal engagement charrette with City Staff, Parks Maintenance, City Council and Parks Commission representatives to develop multiple concepts for each park, identifying near-term and long-term planning. The park concepts were presented in a public open house and online for review and comment by the residents of Burnsville to help inform the final plans for each park. The final products illustrate the near term and long-term visions for each park and are intended to guide decision making and funding for maintenance, replacement, and improvements for each of these parks.

Park Vision Plan Purpose and Use

Introduction

A Parks Vision Plan is a strategic document that outlines the long-term goals, priorities, and vision for a community's parks, recreation facilities, and open spaces. Its primary purpose is to guide future development, improvements, and management of park systems to ensure they meet the needs of residents and visitors.

Key Purposes of a Parks Vision Plan:

1. Guides Future Development
 - Establishes a roadmap for maintaining, expanding and enhancing parks and recreation facilities over time.
2. Reflects Community Needs & Desires
 - Incorporates public input to ensure parks align with the preferences and priorities of residents.
3. Promotes Sustainability
 - Encourages environmentally responsible planning, protecting natural resources and green spaces.
4. Enhances Quality of Life
 - Supports physical, mental, and social well-being by improving recreational opportunities and access to nature.
5. Improves Connectivity & Accessibility
 - Ensures parks and trails are well-integrated into the community, providing equitable access for all users.

Using a Parks Vision Plan effectively ensures that a community's parks, trails, and recreational spaces evolve according to strategic goals and public needs. Here's how to use it:

1. Guide Decision-Making

- Use the plan as a framework for park development, improvements, and maintenance.
- Ensure new projects align with the plan's priorities, such as sustainability and accessibility.

2. Engage the Community

- Use the plan to communicate goals and progress with residents, stakeholders, and advocacy groups.
- Encourage public participation in future park enhancements and policy decisions.

3. Prioritize & Implement Projects

- Set clear timelines for projects and improvements based on funding, community needs, and environmental considerations.
- Regularly review and update the plan to reflect changing demographics, recreation trends, and new opportunities.

4. Track Progress & Measure Success

- Develop performance metrics to assess whether the parks system is meeting goals (e.g., increased park usage, better accessibility, improved environmental health).
- Adjust the plan based on data, feedback, and changing community needs.

Key Considerations Informing the Park Vision Plans

2024 PARKS PLAN ENGAGEMENT DATA, INVENTORY AND ASSESSMENT.

Through extensive community engagement—including surveys, charrettes, and park pop-ups—we gathered a substantial amount of input, capturing residents' voices and priorities. With over 2,600 participants, the engagement reflected the community's demographic makeup. The 2024 Parks Plan engagement set goals, objectives, and strategies for future park development, addressing current trends, public needs, and the replacement of outdated infrastructure. Community feedback emphasized the need for park amenity improvements, enhanced trail connectivity, and expanded programming. The engagement results highlight the importance of ongoing public involvement in shaping park policies, setting priorities, and guiding decision-making and implementation.

PARK VISION PLAN ENGAGEMENT

The Park Vision Plan engagement included events such as the Park-a-Palooza event, the open house, park pop-ups, and the Camp Explore engagement. Additionally, community input was gathered through surveys, online feedback, postcards distributed during Night to Unite, and direct mailings to neighborhoods. Through this engagement process, participants expressed a clear desire for improved

park amenities, better-connected trail systems, and an expansion of recreational programming and activities.

CREATING PARKS FOR ALL

Access and inclusion were prioritized features such as inclusive play areas, improved pathways for mobility, and amenities that accommodate diverse community needs. By integrating universal design principles, the parks promote equity, fostering spaces where everyone—regardless of age or ability—can connect, recreate, and enjoy the outdoors.

TRENDS

Trends are constantly evolving, making it essential to maintain a flexible park system that adapts to emerging needs while preserving amenities and spaces for existing activities. Key trends shaping park planning include Health and Wellbeing, Local School Sport Trends, Technology Trends, Demand for Informal Recreation, Specialized Facilities and non-Traditional Activities, Changing Demographics, Connection to the Land, Park Facility Trends, Current Programming Trends, Playground Trends, Support Economic Development and Decline in Youth Sports. Community Engagement Overview

Introduction

This chapter is a short overview of the community engagement done for the Burnsville Parks Visioning Plan. Please see chapter 5 for in-depth community engagement results and comments.

The recently completed City of Burnsville Parks Plan provided critical information to guide the future of the city's park system. Extensive community engagement was conducted, reaching an accurate representation of the city's demographic composition and reflecting the voice of its residents. The Parks Plan outlined the goals, objectives, and strategies for the future development of parks, taking into account current trends, public needs and desires, as well as identifying outdated and failing park infrastructure in need of replacement.

Upon approval of the Parks Plan, the city gained a clear understanding of its existing park system and its locations. However, there was a recognition of the need to ensure that as new developments and park asset replacements occur, these amenities are placed in the most optimal locations. This question led to the initiation of the Burnsville Parks Visioning Study, which focused on creating master plans for 26 community and neighborhood parks across the city. The goal was to inform both current and future park implementation and maintenance.

These park master plans were developed based on the Parks Plan, previous and current public engagement, input from city staff, and ongoing planning efforts. Below is a summary of the key elements that shaped the master plan concepts.

Park-A-Palooza Event : Overview

Confluence re-imagined the traditional charrette with Park-a-palooza, an innovative approach that blended efficiency, intensity, fun, and insightful collaboration. This dynamic workshop allowed city staff at all levels to actively engage with the design team, fostering a deeper understanding of design challenges and opportunities. By encouraging real-time collaboration, Park-A-Palooza ensured diverse ideas were shared, leading to more inclusive solutions.

Designed for rapid idea generation, this method streamlined the creative process, allowing the team to explore a variety of concepts and refine them into actionable solutions in a short time frame. The structured format kept the process focused, productive, and engaging. The Park-A-Palooza accelerated decision-making and strengthened partnerships between city staff and designers, ensuring the final park designs reflected community needs and aspirations.



Effective design charrettes transform visions into reality, blending design, nature, and community into seamless, sustainable spaces.

Park-A-Palooza Event : Overview



Over the course of the day, designs and drawings were developed and gradually took shape, reflecting the collaborative input from all involved. The primary focus was on the big picture for the parks, with efforts concentrated on identifying the most effective layout for essential elements such as park amenities, parking, sustainability features, gathering spaces, facilities, maintenance considerations,

and other ideas brought forward by both the public and staff. This collective effort ensured that the final design met the diverse needs of the community while fostering a cohesive, functional, and sustainable park environment.

The Parks Vision Plans outline opportunities to enhance and preserve each park, ensuring they continue to meet the needs of the Burnsville community. Shaped by public engagement, these plans align with long-term goals, priorities, and the overall vision for Burnsville's parks and recreational facilities. Their primary purpose is to guide future development, improvements, and park management to benefit both residents and visitors.

Each park features two plans: a Base Plan and a Vision Plan. The Base Plan highlights near-term improvements planned over the next five to ten years, while the Vision Plan outlines long-term concepts for enhancements projected ten or more years into the future. These long-term plans will undergo further community engagement and planning before implementation.

Community Engagement Results

Introduction

This chapter presents a comprehensive summary of the extensive community engagement efforts that played a crucial role in shaping the vision and base plans outlined in Chapter 4.

It highlights the valuable input received from a wide range of community members through various outreach activities. In particular, this chapter includes detailed feedback collected during the Park-a-Palooza event, as well as all of the responses gathered from the Social Pinpoint online survey platform. These insights reflect the diverse perspectives, needs, and aspirations of the community and serve as a vital component in guiding the overall planning process.

Park-A-Palooza Event : Comments Received

CLIFF FEN PARK:

The trail on Northwest goes to Black Dog Park – state or DNR trail (we believe) it used to loop but now it dead ends.

Provide a loop trail for maintenance access.

Loop Trails would be nice for the park.

Nature trail exists in the lower parking lot, but no one knows they exist. Hard to see and has ends at an interpretive sign that highlights the wetland environment. It is preferred to remove this trail or expand and connect it further to make more of the features that people know is there.

Shelters are used all summer and always booked. More shelters should be considered.

In dire need of maintenance drive to the shelter. Vehicles that will be driven, Garbage truck, Reservation truck and city vehicles

Drainage issue around splash pad – becomes muddy

Volleyball court used for volleyball league

The second parking lot is used to pile snow in winter and has undesirable activity at times.

Playground is 6-7 years old

Playground needs to be redone

Wood chips in playground – kids take the wood chips to splash pad blocking the outlet. Rain of this year settled the wood chips – maybe a poured in place surface or engineered wood fiber would be better.

Destination Park – consider maintaining a destination playground here in the future. Focus on inclusion perhaps.

Sand play is desired – kids play sand all the time so highly recommended at this site

Shade structures + benches + seating

Consider artificial turf fields for the soccer pitches.

Consider providing Bathroom/ restroom facilities- esp with splash pad – issue with running water to the park with no utilities under adjacent county road.

Parking lots need work
